HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Research, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from March 6 through March 8, 2019. A total of 625 registered Arkansas voters were interviewed statewide by telephone.

Those interviewed were selected randomly from a telephone-matched Arkansas voter registration list that included both land line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than \pm 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.

QUESTION: Arkansas is the only state that does not require landlords to provide a minimum level of habitability for rental housing, such as fixing roof leaks, providing hot water and removing mold. Would you support or oppose changing state law to require landlords to do so? (Is that strongly support/oppose or somewhat support/oppose?)
